This term students are learning about the World War 1. The aim of the lessons is to know and understand how frightening World War 1 was from its inception with the alliance system and the assassination of archduke Franz Ferdinand to the battlefields on the Western Front and how industrialisation changed the fighting into a static war of attrition.

Students will learn and understand key historical skills throughout such as the continuity and change in the recruitment of men for Kitchener's army, the causes of the war and the consequences which followed, the similarities and differences of the weapons used on the battlefields, the significance of women on the Home Front, why building trenches led to a static war of attrition and interpretations about whether it is fair to call Field Marshall Haig as the 'Butcher of the Somme.'
